Discover the Canal

- Dundas and Avoncliff aqueducts.
- Wooden and iron drain plug pulleys.
- 1813 water powered pump at Claverton.
- Tow rope marks in the corners of bridges.
- Quarter mile posts showing distance from the river Thames at Reading.
- Widcombe flight of locks accessing river navigation to Bristol.
- Two swing bridges – one of the earliest known uses of the ball bearing.
- The junction with the part restored Somerset Coal Canal at Dundas Wharf featuring cast iron crane.
- Elegant cast iron bridges through Sydney Gardens (Holburne Museum).
- Stop gates where sections of the canal were closed for maintenance, together with stop planks on racks re-using rails from the Avon and Gloucester Tramway.

Discover the River Valleys

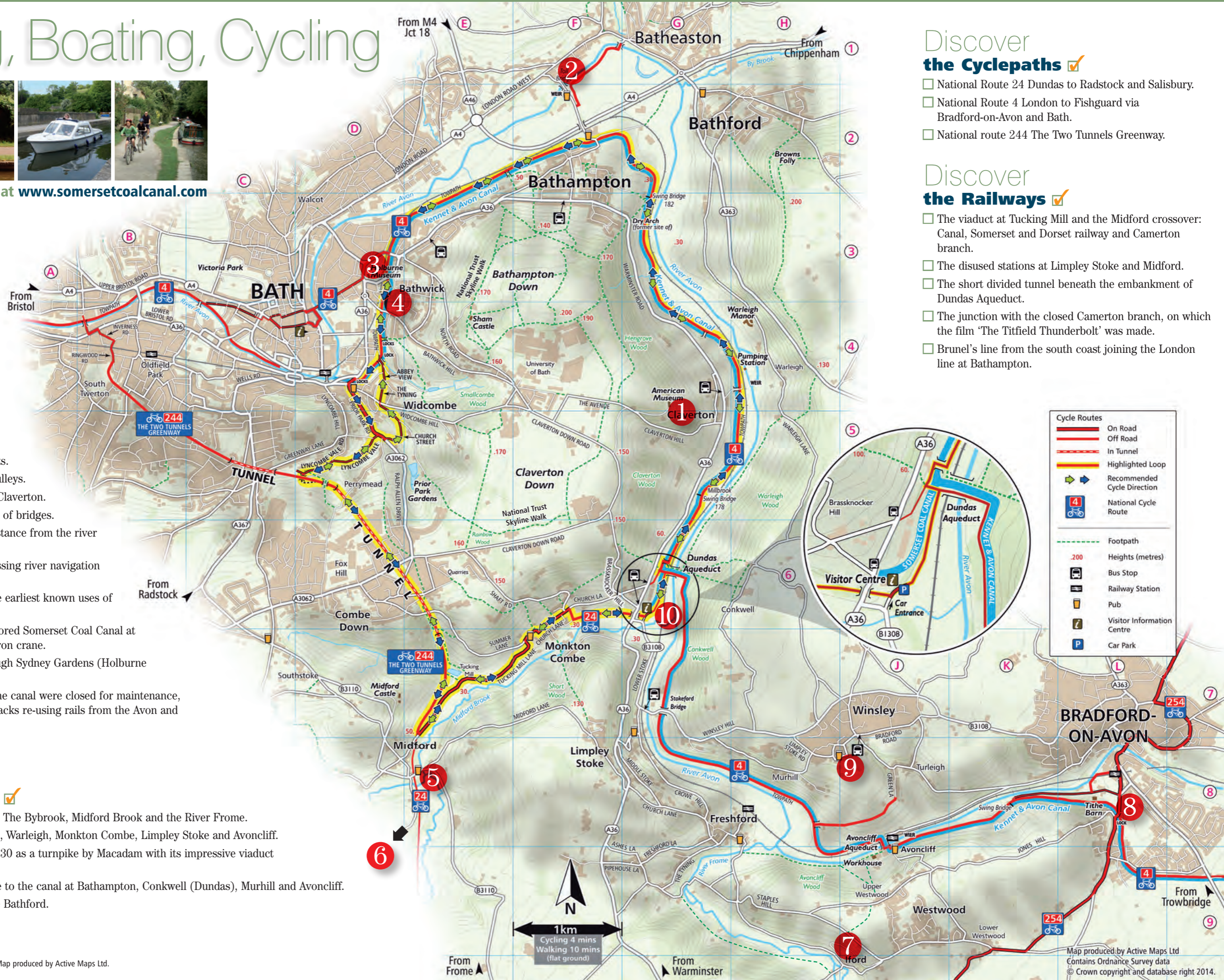
- The River Avon, its tributaries: The Bybrook, Midford Brook and the River Frome.
- Weirs and Mills at Bathampton, Warleigh, Monkton Combe, Limpley Stoke and Avoncliff.
- The A36 trunk road built in 1830 as a turnpike by Macadam with its impressive viaduct over Midford Brook.
- Tramway routes bringing stone to the canal at Bathampton, Conkwell (Dundas), Murhill and Avoncliff.
- Brown's Folly on the hill above Bathford.

Discover the Cyclepaths

- National Route 24 Dundas to Radstock and Salisbury.
- National Route 4 London to Fishguard via Bradford-on-Avon and Bath.
- National route 244 The Two Tunnels Greenway.

Discover the Railways

- The viaduct at Tucking Mill and the Midford crossover: Canal, Somerset and Dorset railway and Camerton branch.
- The disused stations at Limpley Stoke and Midford.
- The short divided tunnel beneath the embankment of Dundas Aqueduct.
- The junction with the closed Camerton branch, on which the film 'The Titfield Thunderbolt' was made.
- Brunel's line from the south coast joining the London line at Bathampton.
